After the death of Eberhard Otto in October 1974, shortly before the conclusion of the first volume, Wolfhart Westendorf jumped in as co-editor. In total, published in the Harrassowitz -Verlag six volumes, which were supplemented by an index volume and a volume for supplements and corrections.

After the death of Otto Eberhard in October 1974, shortly before the end of the first volume, Wolfhart Westendorf stepped in as co-editor. Overall, published in six volumes Harrassowitz - Verlag, supplemented by an index tape and a tape for additions and corrections.
